MAULANA WAHIDUDDIN KHAN points out simple facts that make us sit up and see the bigger picture

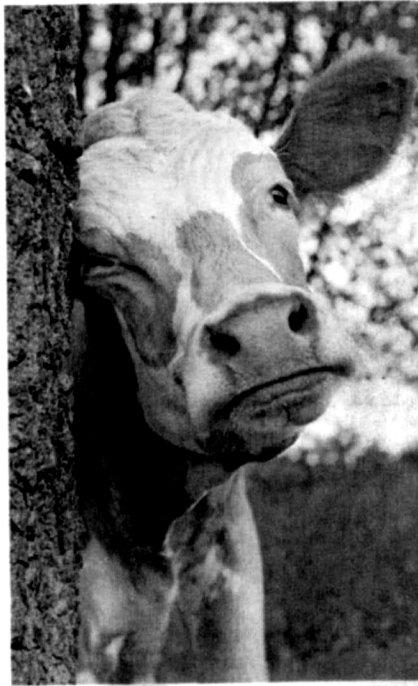
